The International Tax Compliance Regulations 2015 give effect to three separate agreements:

- the Multilateral Competent Authority Agreement on the Automatic Exchange of Financial Account Information, which implements the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development's (OECD's) Common Reporting Standard (CRS);
- the revised European Directive on Administrative Co-operation (DAC); and
- the UK's agreement with the United States regarding the US Foreign Account Tax Compliance Act (FATCA).

These new regulations were enacted in the UK as International Tax Compliance Regulations by Statutory Instrument 2015/878 and require us to collect information about each customer's tax residency and to share information on your account with HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) in certain circumstances (including if we don't receive a valid self-certification from you). HMRC will then share this information with the tax authorities in the relevant countries and territories that are party to the three agreements listed above.
